#### Job purpose

Cardiff City Academy is an integral part of the Club's vision. A fantastic opportunity has arisen to join the Cardiff City Academy Coaching Department in a part-time, consultancy capacity.

We are now seeking part-time coaches who will play a pivotal role in providing our schoolboy players with an excellent grounding in skill development in line with the academy blueprint. The successful candidate will be provided with support in their professional development by the Phase Lead staff and Head of Coaching.

#### Main duties

- The successful candidate will work within a designated age-group in the academy schoolboy structure. (U9-U14) You will be expected to plan, deliver, and evaluate coaching sessions in line with the club's coaching blueprint.
- Matchday coaching will be a fundamental aspect of the role.
- The candidate will be expected to provide individual support to players, delivering individual learning plans and maintaining records on the clubs Kitman Labs, Football Intelligence Platform, ensuring standards are met to comply with the EPPP category 2 guidelines. Facilitating a holistic learning environment with a player centred approach is essential.
- Please note that candidates will be required to work during evenings and weekends.
- To follow and implement the Academy playing and coaching philosophy whilst contributing to its evolution.
- To ensure a thorough working knowledge of the content and functions of the Academy performance plan.
- To work as part of a multidisciplinary support team involving, but not restricted to, head of coaching and player development, performance analysts, sports scientists, physiotherapists, psychologists, operational and administrative staff.
- To help develop IDP for the players within the age groups and execute, monitor, and review the delivery of such programs.
- To ensure player safeguarding is always the primary consideration in all players activities.
- To attend staff meetings as and when required (unless exceptional circumstances apply).
- To maintain a current and up to date status with all work and communication involving the Football Intelligence Platform (including coaching

sessions, game details and all aspects of the individual learning plans).

- To adhere to a strict code of confidentiality in respect of any information relating to Cardiff City Football Club and its operations.
- To be always presentable when working and demonstrate that you can represent the face of the club in the manner expected.
- To maintain Cardiff City Football Club's Safeguarding, Health, Safety and Equal Opportunity procedures and practice.
