- Integrate an evidenced based approach to practice.
- Continually evolve the physical development curriculum in line with the 'Academy Blueprint' ensuring delivery and review of a modern and innovative approach.
- Provide a high standard of Athletic Development coaching to respective age groups, educating them in line with the Cardiff City Academy and methodology.
- To ensure that all Academy players adhere to the Cardiff City Academy Blue Standards.
- To assist players to set individual short, medium and long-term goals and to create, monitor and evaluate holistic Individual Development Plans.
- Ensure all physical development practices are documented, recorded and evaluated on KML/FiP
- To complete player progress reports on record accordingly.
- Complete CPD (Continuous Professional Development) to maintain qualifications and personal currency and deliver appropriate CPD to ensure constant development of PT staff.
- To work with relevant staff in supporting the development of PT Athletic Development staff.
- Challenge working practices and input into training session design to ensure healthy

- To identify players available for games and communicate any additional player requirements to the Lead Phase Coach at the earliest opportunity.
