1	<p>Welcome and agenda</p> <p>Welcome</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Matters arising from last meeting • Club review of recent matches • SWP update on home games • Away fixtures review • Upcoming fixtures ticket information • Supporters' groups update • Any other business <p>PC thanked everyone for their attendance and began the meeting.</p>
2	<p>Minutes of the previous meeting</p> <p>These were agreed and are available on the CCFC website.</p>
3	<p>Matters arising from previous minutes (not on the agenda)</p> <p>The museum is currently on hold, but work is still being done in the background.</p> <p>MS said the Trust had met with the Foundation recently and the museum is still on the agenda.</p> <p>PC said that seating will be placed around the concourses to assist fans; these will be in place by the next home fixture in the Ninian stand concourse.</p> <p>“I’ll be there” was played at the stadium at the last match and will continue to be on the song list at home games.</p>
4	<p>Club review of recent matches</p> <p>Crowds have been decent at home games; we have received a few complaints from fans about behaviour in the back of the Canton Stand and overcrowding. The Safety Officer is aware, and the area is monitored; more stewards will be deployed to this area.</p> <p>The Chelsea game saw a sell out crowd of over 33,000 and it was a great success with over 3,000 Chelsea fans in the stadium. Unfortunately, in the first few minutes of the game a small number of fans in the lower grandstand started a homophobic chant; this was quickly drowned out by the rest</p>

	<p>of the crowd and stewards moved in but couldn't identify the culprits. A warning was sent to the crowd, and this chant was not heard again. The FA have charged the Club.</p> <p>PC said that the Club cannot argue that these chants did not occur, but we have a lot of mitigation due to multiple groups backing the club with support saying we did all we possibly could to avoid this happening. The Club is dedicated to providing the best possible matchday experience for all visitors to Cardiff City Stadium.</p> <p>VA felt this was unfair considering we get called "sheep sha**ers" at every match and nothing is done.</p> <p>PC said that there are specific guidelines about what is considered offensive and what clubs can be charged with.</p>
5	<p>South Wales Police update on home games</p> <p>SC said that youth risk group, 'Soul Crew Youth' are persistently causing issues at home games, mainly in the city centre, not inside the stadium. Ninety of them turned out for the Stockport game where we dealt with them by way of Section 50. We will use anti-social behaviour (ASB) powers to obtain their name and addresses; Cardiff City and South Wales Police have written to their parents since and we plan a joint session with the Club to address matters (likely during the off-season).</p> <p>PC said he had not seen any issues of this group at away games, but is based at the stadiums, not in the city centres.</p>
6	<p>Away fixtures review</p> <p>PC spoke through the seven away games since the last meeting and explained that we had taken over 10,000 fans to those away games and apart from some minor incidents, the behaviour of the fans has been excellent and a credit to the club.</p> <p>CE said the police have had to deal with some fans at these games. He listed the offences and incidents that had occurred during this period. But this was a tiny number of issues in comparison to the number of fans who had travelled.</p> <p>KJ commented on the fact that there had been numerous issues for disabled fans during this period due to coach parking restrictions and location of parking.</p> <p>TJ said he was unhappy that the CCSC seemed to have been given priority parking at Orient.</p> <p>CE informed everyone that he was advised of the parking very late and made a quick decision to contact VA so that these spaces could be utilised. It was not favouritism, simply the best option so late in the day.</p> <p>PC agreed that it has been difficult this season, especially with the large volume of coaches we take compared to other clubs, but we always try to assist all coach organisers if we can.</p>
7	<p>Upcoming ticket information</p> <p>Doncaster Rovers: 2,700 tickets sold, only 250 left. These are all digital tickets. Barnsley and Exeter City go on sale Tuesday (tomorrow) in stages. We only have 1,150 tickets for the Exeter game and they will sell out quickly. We have plenty of tickets for Barnsley and again these will be digital. The Huddersfield Town game is likely to be postponed due to international call-ups.</p>
8	<p>Supporters' groups' updates</p> <p>Cardiff City Disabled Supporters' Association</p> <p>KJ had given flyers around with the work that the DSA are involved in. DSA have just bought a large TV (65") for the DSA room; this will be fitted soon with an external box, which will now allow all to see from the far side of the room. For the 1927 dementia group, they will now have access to watch old games with members of the FPA coming in to talk about the games. DSA trip availability for Reading has now closed and 49 members will be travelling.</p> <p>Cardiff City Supporters' Club</p> <p>VA explained the work the Supporters' Club has done since the start of the season and how the CCSC has been able to run coaches at a loss to assist fans by keeping consistently low prices. There was no kids Christmas party due to fixture congestion, but they were looking at something around Easter for the children; however, with fixture congestion and many dates not available, they cannot do this. They are looking at what options are available.</p> <p>Cardiff City Supporters' Trust</p> <p>MSP said the Trust have an event on Thursday at CCS with all monies raised going to the Don Murray fund. Raffle tickets are available online and on the night. The Trust recently met with the Foundation about the Cardiff City Museum; unfortunately, no financial assistance is available from CCFC until next season. They will carry on meeting with the Foundation and Club.,</p>

9	<p>Any other business?</p> <p>PC said his nephew tested the new Give Vision (Sight plus) headset for the partially blind last week; it was an amazing experience for him and enabled him to see players at a distance for the first time in his life. Chloe McBratney from the Foundation, who has a guide dog, tried these and was also impressed. These are currently being tested but hopefully is something we can have at the stadium in the future.</p> <p>PC said that Brian Barry-Murphy is out in the community in the next few weeks visiting fan groups in Aberdare and the Rhondda.</p> <p>PC mentioned travel group regular Keith Edwards (Jumbo) from Mountain Ash who is currently in hospital, wishing him well.</p>
