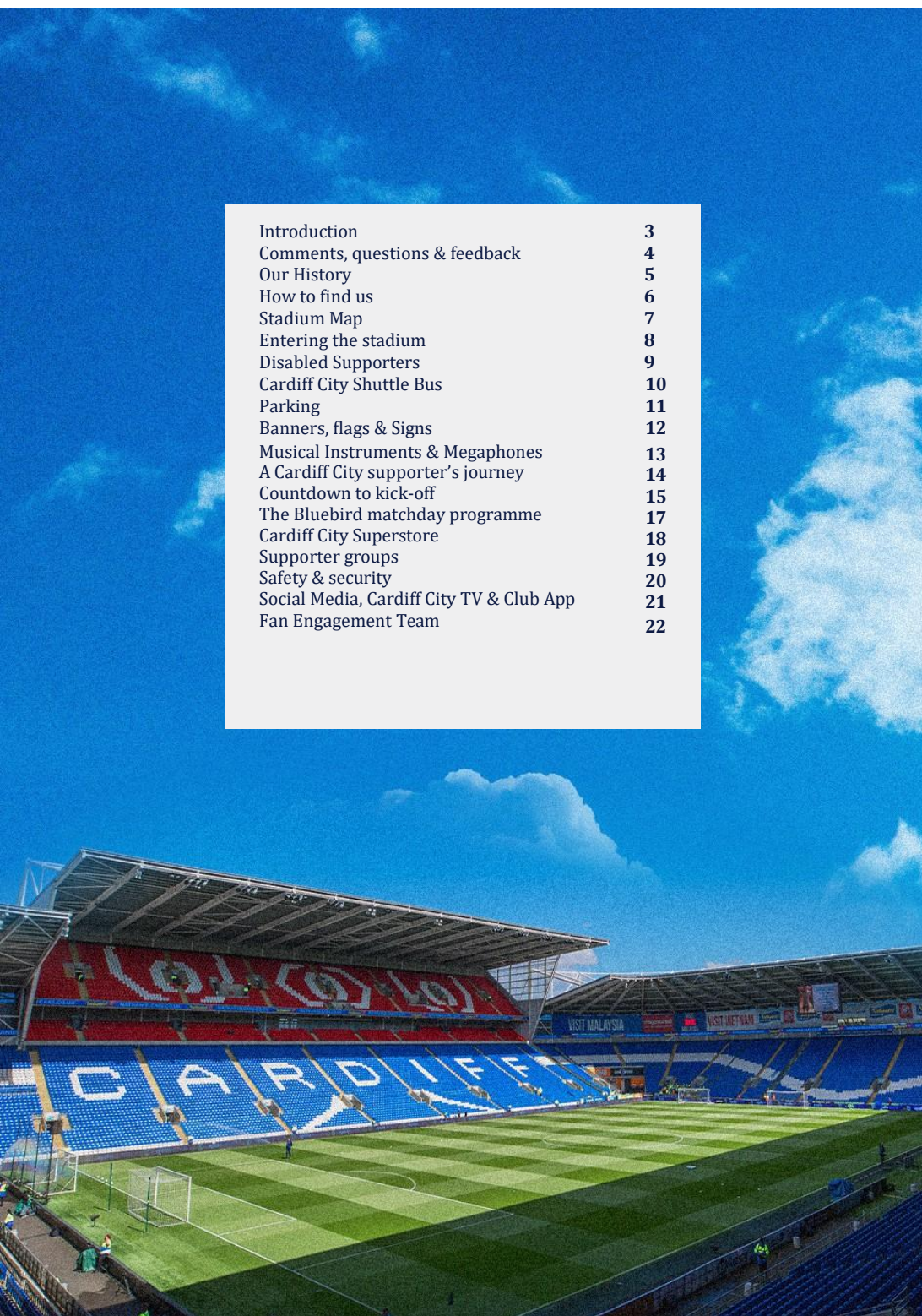

Whether you are coming to watch a match, planning a trip to the Superstore or simply stopping by, this guide aims to help. It contains all the information you need to ensure you have a great time, including directions, parking information and much more.

Cardiff City Stadium accommodates visitors from all communities and of all ages, and our aim is to ensure that each visitor has an enjoyable experience.

We hope that this guide helps with your planning and enjoyment of the time you intend to spend with us.

Cardiff City FC has been recognised by several bodies in recent seasons. We have been awarded the Level Playing Field's 'Excellence Award' and are also recipients of the EFL Family Excellence Award.

We have previously been chosen as the 'Away Fan Experience' winner and have received the Premier League Extra Mile Award.

We aim to continue to be seen as a Club that does its utmost to ensure everyone enjoys themselves during their visit and we work tirelessly to maintain the reputation we have worked hard to build.

We will **not** tolerate inappropriate behaviour or actions. We expect our supporters to act in such a way that does not bring the Club into disrepute. Any such behaviour or actions will be dealt with accordingly.

## COMMENTS, QUESTIONS AND FEEDBACK

At our matches, we are pleased to welcome supporters irrespective of race, gender, age, religion, disability, or sexual orientation. We do operate a minimum age restriction (14 years) for 'unaccompanied' youths, as per our Safeguarding Policy.

To ensure matchdays are as enjoyable as possible, we operate a "Report It" facility. This enables visitors to inform us, in confidence, of any issues that may be spoiling their enjoyment. ## HOW TO FIND US

If you are coming by car, access from the motorway is easy. Leave the M4 at Junction 33 and take the A4232 towards Cardiff/Barry. Exit the A4232 onto the B4267, signposted Cardiff City Stadium. Please enter through our Main Entrance, directly off the A4232.

**(Please note our car park can close up-to 60 minutes before kick-off.)**

Our postcode is **CF11 8AZ**. However, please note that following a Satellite Navigation System may direct you through Cardiff City Centre, potentially adding around 30 minutes to your journey.

## ALTERNATIVE WAYS TO GET TO CCS:

**By Train:** From Cardiff Central, supporters can travel to Ninian Park or Grangetown stations. It is then a 10-minute walk to the stadium from Grangetown or 5 minutes from Ninian Park.

**By Taxi:** Taxis are readily available across the city. You can pre book a 'Private Hire' or Uber or -hail a black and white cab. A trip from the City Centre to the stadium costs between £7 - £10.

**By Bus:** Service Number **1** and **2** (City centre, Cardiff Bay to Sloper Road) 95 to Leckwith Rd

Additionally, Cardiff Bus operates a two way shuttle bus service between Wood Street and the Stadium. It runs from two hours before kick off and then every 15 minutes. The return journey leaves the stadium shortly after the end of matches and continues until crowds have cleared.

Normal fares apply, and Cardiff Bus day, week, 4 week and Annual Tickets are valid on this service.

## ENTERING THE STADIUM

Please purchase an appropriate ticket for the relevant event in good time, as tickets in some areas do sell out in advance.

When you arrive at your Gate:

- Have your physical ticket or mobile/digital ticket ready when approaching the turnstile.
- Prepare for a quick body search and open any coats or jackets.
- Place your ticket or phone up against the reader within the turnstile.
- Once you hear the tone, and the light turns **green\***, proceed through the turnstile and into the stadium.
- Enjoy the event and your time with us at Cardiff City Stadium.

\*In the event the light either turns **red**, or the reader does not react, please exit the turnstile, and see one of our Customer Support Stewards wearing purple tabards, who will help resolve the problem.





## DISABLED SUPPORTERS

We have dedicated stewards available to help, support and assist disabled supporters. Our Disability Access Officer, Ben Jones, can be contacted via email at [ben.jones@cardiffcityfc.co.uk](mailto:ben.jones@cardiffcityfc.co.uk) as necessary. If you have any problems or queries, please do not hesitate to contact Ben.

We have over 120 pre allocated disabled Parking Bays at Cardiff City Stadium. Season Tickets can be bought but do generally sell out.

**On matchday, if you have a Disabled Persons Badge, please speak to one of our Car Park Stewards who will direct you to the most appropriate unallocated space. Most of our accessible spaces are pre-sold. Please do not park in these spaces.**

If upon arrival, you have any accessibility problems please ask a Car Park Steward for assistance.

We do have four additional accessibility bays (two in Zone A and two in Zone C) which can be used on matchdays as directed by Car Park Stewards.

## Cardiff City Stadium Shuttle Bus

We're run shuttle buses on route 95 between the city centre and Cardiff City Stadium for league games during the 24/25 season.

Buses will depart from Wood Street (JB) in the city centre and run every 15 minutes to the stadium, with the first bus leaving 2 hours before kick off. After the match, buses will run back to the city centre until the crowds have cleared.

Normal fares apply, and Cardiff Bus day, week, 4 week and annual ticket are valid on this service.

## PARKING

### Season Long Car Parking

We have a limited number of spaces for on-site parking available for seasonal purchase, available by emailing [tickets@cardiffcityfc.co.uk](mailto:tickets@cardiffcityfc.co.uk). They are sold on a first come, first served basis with priority given to existing Pass Holders.

We also have some designated accessible parking bays. Please contact our Disability Access Officer, Ben Jones at [ben.jones@cardiffcityfc.co.uk](mailto:ben.jones@cardiffcityfc.co.uk) to purchase these.

### Matchday Parking

We have on-site parking available on matchdays, usually accessible up to 30 minutes before kick-off. Car parking costs £10 per vehicle (cash only). Spaces are available on a first come, first served basis. Please enter through our Main Entrance.

Please note that our Car Park can close 60 minutes before kick-off. No entry will be permitted after closure.

We respectfully ask visitors to use our on-site parking facilities and consider our neighbours by not obstructing footways and/or private entrances. Cardiff Council Enforcement Officers and South Wales Police are on duty on event days and will ensure vehicles are parked legally, issuing Penalty Charge Notices where appropriate.





## BANNERS, FLAGS & SIGNS

Cardiff City Stadium welcomes support as demonstrated by banners, flags and signs.

However, to ensure these articles do not upset or distract others, we ask that the custodian adheres to the following guidelines:

- They are not more than 8ft x 4ft (larger items such as crowd surfing banners allowed only by prior consent).
- They have an appropriate fire certificate.
- They are not placed in the eyesight of other visitors.
- They do not obstruct any signage or advertising.
- They are not of a discriminatory, commercial, political, contentious, or obscene nature.
- They are not likely to cause alarm or distress to other visitors, supporters or groups/football clubs, its directors and/or staff.

The ~~Head of Stadium Operations/Stadium Manager~~/Safety Officer reserves the right and sole discretion to deny a custodian permission to bring into, or display within, Cardiff City Stadium any Banner, Flag or Sign.

## MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS / MEGAPHONES

Our stadium policy is not to allow such items.



## A CARDIFF CITY SUPPORTER'S JOURNEY

At Cardiff City Football Club, we aim to provide the best matchday experience to fans of all ages.

We are proud to have a dedicated team of staff on hand to ensure that everybody coming to the stadium has an enjoyable experience in a safe and friendly environment. Each of our stands is tailored to suit different age groups and preferences as we try to create a lifelong affinity with the club and allow supporters to grow alongside us. The journey for most starts as a junior supporter in the Family Stand.

### The Family Stand

The Family Stand offers junior supporters the chance to meet and hear from their favourite City players in Q&A sessions held prior to kick-off. It also hosts our Ricoh projector screen and PS4 station so all the family can enjoy the content of Cardiff City TV or play a game of FIFA. You can also find a football zone where you can put your skills to the test, as well as being entertained by our resident dance troupe.



### The Canton Stand

The loudest and most lively of our four home stands. We regularly host live music and entertainment in this area on matchdays, helping to build the atmosphere in the lead up to kick-off. We also have a large screen showing the best of Cardiff City TV and any televised matches.



### The Grandstand

The concourse areas within the Grandstand have additional seating for those who want to rest their legs and stay out of the elements before kick-off and at half-time. We also ensure these areas are kept warm.

If you are enjoying our Premier Lounge on Level Four, you can hear from one of our former players who we welcome back to CCS to talk of their days at the Club on the Legends' Stage.



### The Ninian Stand

An area that provides a superb view of the playing surface whilst offering photographic timelines in the concourses. This nostalgic trip gives fans of all ages a chance to soak up the history of the club.

There are no restrictions, allowing you to walk around the majority of the bowl, to enjoy the entertainment. The Upper Ninian Stand was added to the stadium in 2014, increasing the capacity to 33,280.

## SUPPORTER GROUPS

### Cardiff City Fan Advisory Board (CCFCFAB)



The CCFCFAB has been created in line with EFL Regulations 128.1, 128.2 and 128.3. The Board will meet a minimum of two times per season (a minimum of four times in each calendar year) and the Club will host the meetings. Minutes are taken as per the Clubs Fan Engagement Plan. The forum will discuss significant issues relating to the Club, focusing on short, medium and long-term strategies. This affords Club supporters a voice and gives an understanding of some of the decisions making processes that will directly affect them.

The Board is made up of 5 statutory elected Fan Representatives, and another 5 who were directly elected by the fans. They are an independent body who come together with Club hierarchy to include Executive Staff and members of the Board of Directors.

### Cardiff City Supporters Club (CCSC)



CCSC has been serving supporters of Cardiff City Football Club for many years. They hold several events each year, but predominantly organise transport to every First Team away fixture.

The Supporters Club has more than 1,000 members but are always keen to welcome more and are grateful for any assistance from members.

## SAFETY & SECURITY

We believe that the safety and security of all persons, attending (or working at) the Cardiff City Stadium is of paramount importance!

We want everybody to enjoy the game, but fans should also be mindful and respectful of other supporters matchday experience.

The majority of games played at Cardiff City Stadium are "police free" although in some high-profile matches police are deployed at the stadium. Our Stewards have primacy at our matches, and they are trained to look after your Safety and Security, but also to provide the best possible Customer Service and Fan Experience.

We request that all supporters arrive in plenty of time ahead of kick-off. Please take into consideration the time required to pass through stadium security controls prior to entry. Supporters will be required to open their coats / jackets and empty their pockets. Any bags brought in will need to be opened and larger bags will be tagged by stewards. There may be a need for a physical search, failure to adhere to these conditions will result in refusal of entry.

To ensure supporters can enter the ground quickly we would ask that they only bring a minimum number of possessions with them, with the exception of required medical equipment. Please note that there is no storage area for supporters so please do not bring any items that require storage to the Stadium.

### Standing at Football matches – Licensed standing in the Canton Stand

In 2020, Cardiff City FC were in the vanguard of five clubs who took part in the initiative to allow Safe Standing. Following the publication of a CFE Research report for the Sports Grounds Safety Authority (SGSA), Cardiff City Football Club were able to allow a designated Safe Standing area and have installed seats with independent barriers across areas of the Canton Stand, offering a safe standing option to supporters in this area.

Please note, we cannot over occupy this area or facilitate movement of fans into adjacent seats. Ticket checks take place in the vomitories and horizontal gangways, particularly when supporters enter these sectors, and anyone found to be misusing the scheme could face ejection and a club ban.



### Counter Terrorism

**The current terrorist threat level in the UK is substantial - An attack is likely!**

There is no specific threat to Cardiff City stadium, however, terrorism is a real and ongoing concern and supporters should be alert but not alarmed. Occasionally you may see armed police officers, we must all be vigilant and these officers are deployed to deter and reassure.

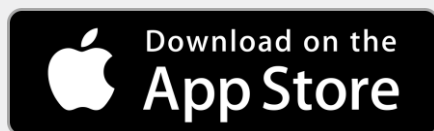
